# Background:

Ultara Development Program Society (UDPS) is an Institution for Social and Financial Services, founded in a remote village at Salander of Sadar Upazila of Thakurgaon distret in the year 1986 at the initiative of its founder AFM Akhter Uddin. In course of time, UDPS diversified its program activities like savings and microcredit operation, education, health and nutrition, water supply and sanitation, women empowerment, child labor, environment and disaster management, food security, housing, agriculture, livestock, fishery, livelihood development, vulnerable group development (VGD), improved cook stoves, char development, waste management, policy advocacy, vocational training etc. UDPS expanded its program activities covering 2752 villages/wards, 835 unions/municipality, 104 upazila of 21 districts under 5 divisions through its 100 branch offices, 21 area offices and 6 zonal offices.

#### Vision:

The vision of UDPS is to build Bangladesh through socio-economic development and sustainable cultural status, environment friendly, based on justice, free from exploitation and discrimination.


#### Mission:

Socio-economic development of rural and urban poor of men and women, adolescent, children, disabled, unemployed youth and disaster affected mass people through an extensive and intensive participatory development process.

#### **Objectives:**

- a) Motivating the rural and urban women to form groups/samity, inspire egular savings, attend regular weekly meeting and provide microcredit so that they can participate in different economic activities.
- b) To provide support services to poor women, make them aware and conscious on education, health care, nutrition, sewerage and sanitation, amily planning, environment, child care and women development.
- c) To extend cooperation and work with Government, donors, INGOs, individually owned or private organizations or national institutions engaged in socio-economic development works, natural/social disasters, escue operation, relief and rehabilitation activities, welfare of disabled, crippled handicapped.
- To establish clinic, maternity hospital, hospital, opening service enter and providing training.
- ) To establish school, college and vocational training institutions with a view to provide national curriculum based education and capacity building of the mass people.

### Management and Good Governance of UDPS:

JDPS has 2 Committees- one is General Committee (GC) and other one is Executive Committee (EC) to maintain efficient management, good governance and transparency of the organization. The General Committee consists of 15 members while the Executive Committee consists of 7 members. The duration of their membership is for 3 years and after expiry new members are inducted and nominated to replace them. The General Committee meeting usually held once in a year while the Executive Committee meeting held at least 4 times in a year for smooth management of the program activities.

Total members: 70,100, Loan beneficiaries: 57,590 (Male:0 + Female: 57,590), Project beneficiaries: 32,297.

#### Savings:

UDPS has been maintaining 3 saving accounts for the welfare of its members - (1) General savings and (2) Voluntary savings. UDPS pays 6% profit on annual basis to the members against their savings. (3) UDPS Monthly Savings Project (UMSP): Monthly installment of UMPS in each account is Tk100/-500/-

#### Microcredit:

Microcredit is provided to the members/clients based on the following components.

**Jagoron** (Rural and Urban Microcredit Program): Under this component, loan and financial assistance is provided to the poor women, manual laborers of rural and sub-rural areas and small and medium businessmen for utilizing their working ability, development of skills and use of local resources.

**Buniad** (Ultra-poor Program): In this component, loan is provided to the rural and urban poor people living below the poverty line, leading if e with dearth of nutrition, illiterate and lack of awareness.

Agrosor (Microenterprise Program): The main objectives of the programs are to extend its financial services to the progressive members for undertaking economic activities that require larger amount of capital for expediting employment generation, creating new employment and income opportunities.



**Sufalon** (Seasonal and Agriculture Loan): Seasonal loans are provided of the beneficiaries for increasing their income instead of other loan ecovery remains outstanding.

**Shahosh** (Disaster Management Loan): Financial assistance to the poor amilies; prevent them from selling valuable family assets or advance abour and enables them to cope with the aftermaths of disasters.

Microfinance for Marginal and Small Farmers (MFMSF): Loan s given to the marginal farmers for their daily agricultural works and aspiring the innovative endeavor in agriculture to increase productivity.

# Ongoing Projects of UDPS

a) Humanitarian Assistance to the Flood Affected Communities of Sirajgonj and Jamalpur districts in Bangladesh-supported by Concern WW- Bangladesh funded by ECHO:

Multipurpose cash grants is provided to meet the basic needs and cash ransfer through cash for work and livelihood support to 2600 flood affected beneficiaries household to restore their livelihood. Project area: Belkuchi and Kazipur upazila of Sirazgonj district Total budget was BDT 29.66 million.

#### p) Pumpkins Against Poverty supported by Practical Action Bangladesh.

The project was designed to help 6000 extreme poor households(30000 ndividuals) women living on flood protection embankments negotiated and secured operational access to sandbars, for improved income, food security, nutrition and access to markets. The project was implemented

at Kurigram sadar, Gangachara upazila and the budget was BDT 34.42 million .

### c) Water Efficiency for Scaling up Sandbar Cropping through a market based approach (USAID-SWFF Project):

The project was designed to develop and promote a commercial model of sandbar cropping by creating access to barren sandbar lands to help the



extreme and vulnerable poor households living on the flood protection embankment for their economic empowerment and sustainable livelihoods development.. The project was implemented with 1000 BHHs at Pirgacha, Kawnia, Gangachara, Ulipur and Chilmari upazilas from October, 2014 to September, 2017 with BDT 10.00 million.



# d) Development of Distressed Women under VGD:

This project is implemented at Nachole upazila of Chapainababgonj and Porsha of Naogaon district for development of socio economic status of 2333 distressed and extreme poor beneficiaries.

#### e) Improved Cook-Stoves (ICS) Program of IDCOL:

JDPS implements the ICS Program in 4 clusters (Tarash, Raigonj, Ullapara and Kamarkhand upazila of Sirazgonj district to install, maintain and supplied 42,151 ICS for a period of 3 years.

### ) Enhancing Resources and Increasing Capacities of Poor Households towards Elimination of their Poverty-ENRICH or Samriddhi of PKSF:

The overall goal of the program is to work with the poor, to create an enabling environment for them to achieve a humanly dignified living standard and enjoy universal human rights. It is implemented in 33 villages of Chandaikona Union under Raigonj upazila of Sirajgonj District. The project aims to provide education, health, credit, beggar rehabilitation, setting upenrich center, community level actions



#### g) UDPS Medicinal Plant Project supported by PKSF:

This project is financially supported by PKSF to increase the income of the entrepreneurs through production, processing and marketing of quality medicinal plants. The duration of the project is 3 (Three) years. A total budget of BDT 12.28 million is spent for 4,600 beneficiaries who are engaged with different activities. The ocation of the project is Sadar and Singra upazila of Natore district).



#### n) UDPS Dairy Value Chain Project under PACE project of PKSF.

This project is financially supported by PKSF to increase the income and create employment opportunity of the entrepreneurs through production and marketing of milk products like butter, cheese, ghee, curd and chana. The duration of the project is 28 months with a total budget of BDT 8.00 million. The location of the project is Shahjadpur apazilla of Sirazgonj district and 2010 beneficiaries are engaged.
